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WELCOME NEW NCCCS SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT AND CHIEF ACADEMIC OFFICER

We would like to welcome Dr. Sharon Morrissey who, on March 1, became the Senior Vice President and Chief Academic Officer for the North Carolina Community College System. She oversees the Academic and Student Services Division which includes Program Services, Student Services, Basic Skills, GED, and Federal Vocation Education. In her previous experience at the System Office, Dr. Morrissey led the conversion from a quarter-based to a semester-based calendar and the development of the statewide comprehensive articulation agreement between community colleges and universities.

Prior to coming to the System Office, Dr. Morrissey served as the sixth president of Richmond Community College. She moved to RCC from Asheville-Buncombe Technical Community College where she served as the Vice President for Instructional Services. Her previous experience includes teaching English at Central Carolina Community College, serving as Vice President for Academic and Student Services at Fayetteville Technical Community College, and serving as Program Coordinator and Associate Vice President for the North Carolina Community College System. Morrissey also taught high school English for several years.

Dr. Morrissey holds a Bachelor's degree in Comparative Literature from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, a Master's degree in English from Western Carolina University, and a Doctoral degree in Higher Education Administration from North Carolina State University.

MINORITY MALE MENTORING COORDINATORS' REGIONAL MEETINGS

The North Carolina Community College Minority Male Mentoring Program held its first set of regional meetings for coordinators during the month of March, 2010. The statewide programs were divided into three regions to better accommodate travel and increase intra-collegiate collaboration. These meetings are the first of many to begin the realignment of the mentoring program to further focus on minority male **developmental course completion, retention, graduation, and transfer**. The meetings allowed coordinators to report on their processes, successes, and challenges.

Coordinators were informed of the SuccessNC Initiative and its goal to increase success for community college students and collect more accurate data. The success of the program and accurate data collection will require a collaborative relationship with other offices on the campus, such as Financial Aid, Records and Registration, and Academic Affairs.

Highlights of the meetings included reports on the NCCCS/UNC collaborative 4-year university visits. This pilot collaboration allowed community college students to spend the day on one of seven 4-year UNC campuses to experience campus life. This pilot is intended to increase interest in transfer opportunities for community college students.
